A letter from Superintendent Brian C. Monahan:

The district began performing water quality testing in accordance with legislation signed by Governor Cuomo on September 6. The new law requires all New York State public schools to test for lead levels of all sources of water used, or potentially used, for drinking or cooking.

The State Department of Health and State Education Department have established an action level of 15 parts per billion (PPB). Water sources that test higher than this threshold and are used for drinking water or food preparation must be removed from service while corrective action is taken.

At the Elementary/Intermediate School, all specified sources of water have been tested. Of the 186 samples drawn, 63 tested above the allowable 15 parts per billion; 20 of the 63 sources were attributable to outdoor hose faucets or custodial closet sinks.


The 43 remaining test results identified 39 handwashing sinks and 4 fountains. All of these fixtures are clearly marked as "Water not suitable for drinking," and the district has made bottled water available. All of these fixtures will be replaced and retested.

The remaining fixtures (i.e., outdoor hoses faucets, custodial closet sinks) will be evaluated on a case by case basis.

Please be assured that we are taking all the necessary steps to ensure that the quality of drinking and cooking water throughout our district meets state regulations. Upon completion of the district's remediation plan and retesting process, we will inform you of the results. The complete test results will be posted on the district's website next week.
